At 1 pm, on the day she was scheduled to be admitted at 3pm, Lacey reached out and tearfully begged for our help. She told us if she didn't have a place for Monk by 3pm, she would have no choice but to release him on the street. With the clock ticking, we rushed to Lacey's apartment and took custody of sweet Monk. With our own facilities and fosters at capacity, he is in private boarding, as he seeks a loving home.




We urgently need to find a home for Monk. He is a real love bug - he just isn't fond of cats. Monk is HW negative and neutered.
