

MORE HELP FOR HORSES THIS MONTH



We pitched in to help four neglected horses and a donkey this month, who were seized by law enforcement in two separate investigations. One complaint involved a handsome paint horse, abandoned and tied to a pole without any food or water. The second complaint involved three malnourished horses and a donkey. Deputies granted custody of the animals to our associate, Brittany Ware, Director of *Hayden's Hoofbeats Haven*; officers plan to charge the previous owners with cruelty. HSLA is funding the vet care and recovery of the horses through our **COPS** program (Cruelty Options for Police and Shelters). While one of the horses sadly didn't survive the ordeal, the others are putting on weight and enjoying life again. Since forming our partnership with *Hayden's Hoofbeats Haven* in Allen parish several years ago, we've helped more than 200 large animals, and Brittany has helped bring charges against more than two dozen animal abusers.

BATON ROUGE GROOMER CITED IN CRUELTY INCIDENT

We received a very disturbing video of a grooming salon incident this month. A groomer blasted a terrified poodle with a relentless and powerful steam of water. It was painful to watch the poor little one flailing around wildly - tied only at the neck - not even touching the bottom of the tub. We advised the complainant to share the film with the director of the *East Baton Rouge Animal Control*, and we're pleased to report that Tawanna Scott, the owner of Pet Parlor Pet Grooming, was subsequently cited, following an investigation.



We were happy to help community kitty Tomcat get needed treatment for a puncture wound on his leg this month. HSLA provides food and assistance to volunteers feeding and caring for hundreds of colony kitties every day.
