Only half of our parishes have animal shelters, and many facilities that exist in rural areas provide extremely limited services. Incredibly, most have no budgets for vet care. We are regularly contacted by shelter workers trying to save injured and suffering animals, who would otherwise be euthanized. Two such dogs your donations helped save this month are JADA and AIDEN (pictured above and below). Both needed leg surgeries to fix broken bones. We were happy to make it possible for them to get needed care and find loving families.
