# HSLA Coordinates \$60K Gift of Supplies for Local Shelters and Rescues. More on the Way!

Last year, we kicked off our first Louisiana Animal Shelter Support Month in June. Even with circumstances markedly different this year, we were determined to lend a helping hand to our state's underfunded shelters and rescues. Luckily, many companies have been assisting animal charities with pet food donations during these hard times, so we looked for another special way to assist. A major and ongoing expense for many small groups is the cost of puppy pads. The pads are widely used to line crates, both in shelters and for transports. (In 'days gone by' groups used lots of donated newspaper, but now that most people get their news online, puppy pads are even more in demand.) A small bag of pads can cost as much as \$20! When we were offered two huge mack truck loads of free puppy pads from Hartz Mountain this month, we knew we had to figure out how to accept this huge donation, valued at close to \$60,000! To store and unload the massive gift, we mobilized dozens of people, both in Mt. Hermon and in New Orleans to unload one truck at each site in the sweltering heat. With no loading dock, forklift or special equipment, the unloading was a serious challenge, but two crews worked tirelessly to get the job done. We rented two storage units in New Orleans and used the opportunity to get a much needed second shipping container at our *Enoch J.* Donaldson Animal Sanctuary. Every open space was filled to the brim with huge bags of puppy pads! The shelters were delighted to receive the free supplies. We've held many giveaway days for 501(c)3 groups and wildlife rehabbers, helping these groups collectively save tens of thousands of dollars. We're saving on puppy pads, too - since we regularly use them for our transports. The giveaway was so successful, Hartz Mountain wants us to distribute another huge donation. This time, they'll be assisting with rabbit and bird food and other small animal supplies. We're very grateful for this new partnership!
